At one time this codex was in the library of Regiomontanus, for written on the inside of the front cover is his symbol, two stars and a cross atop a hill together with "...insigne Regiomontani. Patet ex libris D. i viri Joach. Helleri, 20 Septembri 62." Below that is "Emptus Vitellio ex bibliotheca Alberti Dyreri norici, anno Domini 1555, 13 Augusti. Eras. flock D." which may indicate that the volume passed into the ownership of Albrecht Dürer.* The text is in one hand, one column (16.8 x 25.5 cm), black ink with

red and blue capitals. The diagrams are not so numerous as those found in the editio princeps. The 164 paper leaves were originally bound in parchment, two halves of an ecclesiastical letter ^{us} from James, Bishop of ~~of~~ Adriensis, to the Archbishop of Magutin^{us}, dated 23 October 1409, but now bound in half-leather over boards. Numerous notes are in the hands of Regiomontanus together with a cardboard chart inserted in the codex. The chart contains three illustrations about sines and star sighting. ^{us} falsch. Vorseite
